COCO JACKET



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*Coco is here to become your favorite jacket, cardigan and blazer! With a perfectly fitting yoke with proper tailoring, a deep V-neck, lovely rounded corners at front and pockets, it has it all! The set-in sleeves are loose and airy with a slight balloon-shaped cuff; and the buttons band and buttonholes are discreet and very cute. Coco is constructed from the top-down, starting at the back, then shoulders, then the whole yoke together as one - this means that the jacket is virtually seamless (with the exception of pocket finishing). The body is then worked in conjunction with the pockets, followed by sleeves and body edging. The pattern includes so many modification options to make sure that it fits YOUR body and if you need a bit more support, there is a course in which I walk you through the WHOLE process, start to finish, including how to modify the pattern to your specific measurements. This really is a jacket for everyone!*

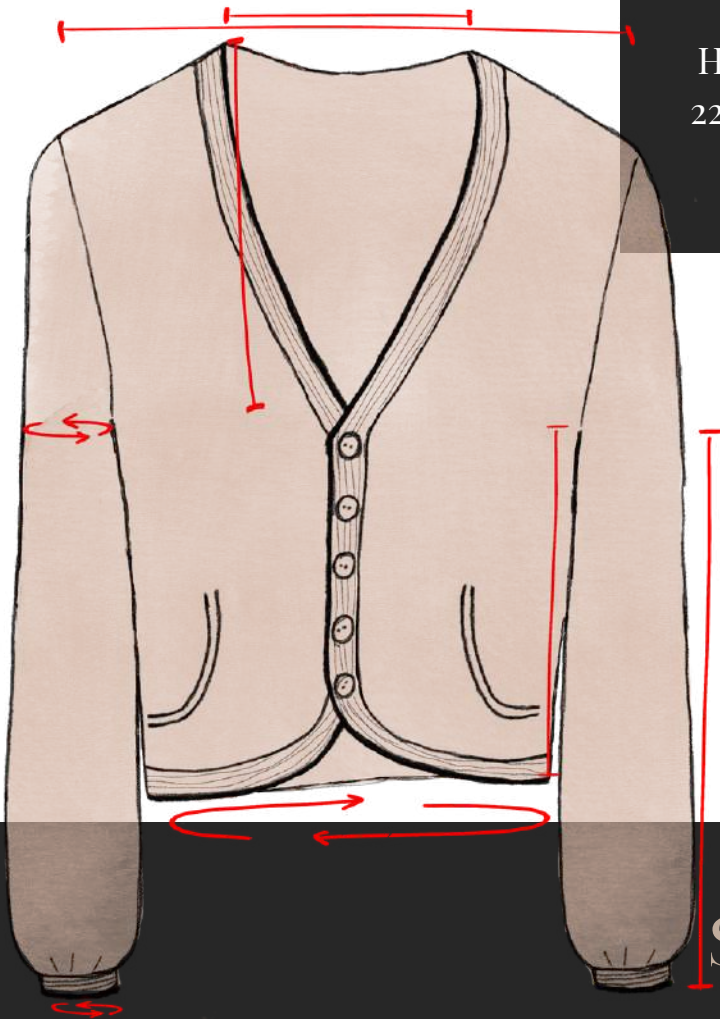

Hip-Length Jacket: 1220 (1355, 1495, 1670, 1825) (2035, 2210, 2430, 2585) m / 1335 (1480, 1635, 1825, 1995) (2225, 2415, 2655, 2825) yds

## MODS

*I followed the pattern for the hip-length jacket, with one modification - following the pockets section, in the "Bottom of Body" section, I did 6 rows instead of 12 rows as suggested for full length. Another modification - as the buttons I used are small, for the button holes I made chain 1 spaces rather than chain 2 spaces.*

## COMMENTS

*My Coco Jacket is a perfect fit! The neck and shoulder shaping is spot on and I'm delighted with how mine turned out. This design is very neat and stylish, not to mention practical. The pockets are what I consider to be "real" pockets as they are deep enough to hold my phone comfortably!*

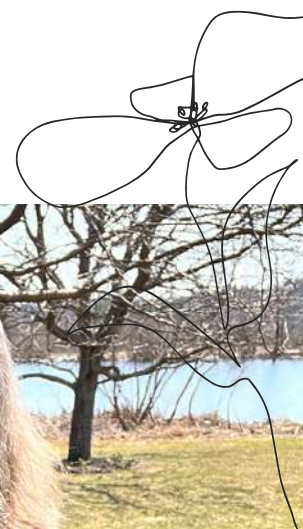

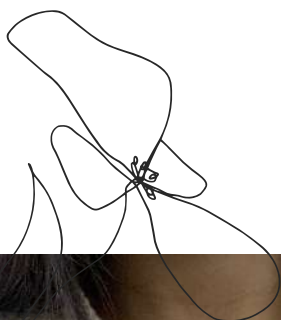

## MODS

*Slightly smaller than gauge to fit me better, using 5mm hook, shortened sleeves and hip length, did one less row of scBLO on the cuffs using the 4.5 mm hook size, and used 4 mm hook for the button band rsc edge for a tauter finish*

## COMMENTS

*I shortened the sleeves and the hip length a bit, but otherwise I'm thrilled with this perfectly fitted jacket! I love the seamless construction from top to bottom with details that are phenomenal in such a minimalistic design. So it's right up my alley! From the pockets to the cuffs and button band and edging and the rounded corners, and the way the sleeves at the shoulders sit juuuuust right. I love it all. Such a genius design.*

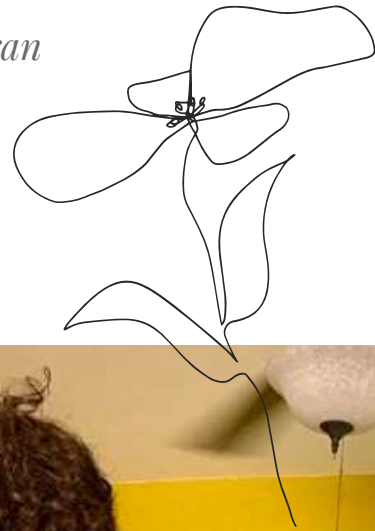

## MODS

*Decreased on sleeves by 2 rows, first row 1 sc, dec around. Second row 1 sc4, dec around. Used 4.5 mm hook for jacket, 4 mm hook for edging, and 3 mm hook for rsc (RSC row tended to wave up a lot)*

## COMMENTS

*I love the look of the sleeves and edging with rounded corners. And especially the \*pockets\* Such a fun project!*



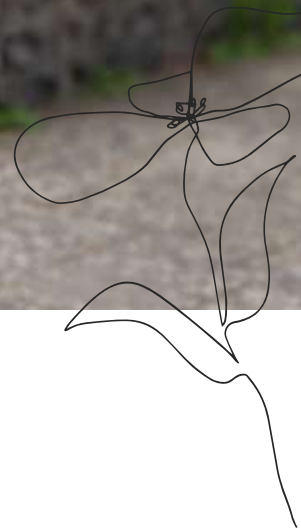

## MODS

*ch 1 and skip 1 for the buttonholes; waist shaping with decrease from 166 sts to 156 sts (row 5, 7, 9, 13, 19); hip shaping with increases from 156 sts to 168 sts (row 2, 11, 15)*

## COMMENTS

*A great construction, especially for the yoke and the pockets. I love that you don't have to sew anything together. It's a classic beautiful design with a gorgeous sleeve shape and sophisticated pockets, collar and cuffs.*



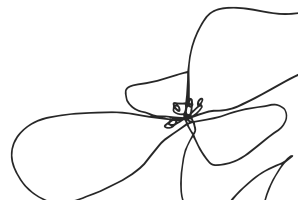

## MODS

*I used the instructions for the crop length and only made one modification. I chained two for the buttonholes instead of one but kept the two single crochet stitches in the buttonhole spaces. I did this to accommodate my larger buttons.*

## COMMENTS

*I love how unique the construction was on this. Everything about how it came together was different from anything else I have done before. One of the main reasons I like being a tester is because more times than not I can learn how to put something together in a way I may have not considered before and this was definitely one I was able to learn from!*

## MODS

*3 rows of hip shaping following the pattern instructions. Used a smaller hook for the whole cuff, not just the rsc.*

## COMMENTS

*I love the construction of this sweater. The shoulders fit so well and the construction of the pockets was so unique. I much prefer the way the pockets were done on this sweater than when patterns have you add them on after. It was great to have hip shaping instructions so I could make the longer length but still have it fit well all over.*

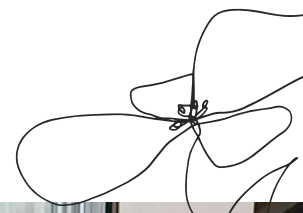

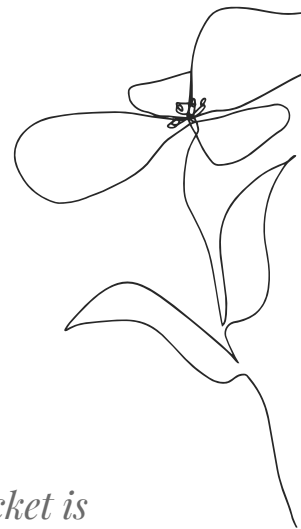

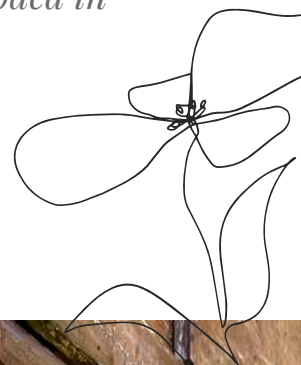

## MODS

*I did two fewer rows on the rounded corners of the body and right/left pockets to get the desired cropped length for my short torso (so rather than repeating rows 1 and 2 a further three times, I repeated them only two times). Forgot to mention this also means you have to adjust the edging -- I just increased between the rounded corner stitch markers in round 1 to make sure I had 9 st between them.*

## COMMENTS

*The way this cardigan is constructed is unlike any pattern I've followed in the past, and I love the fit it achieves. It's easily modified to fit your measurements, and the instructions are clear and detailed all the way through. You'll love the finished garment!*

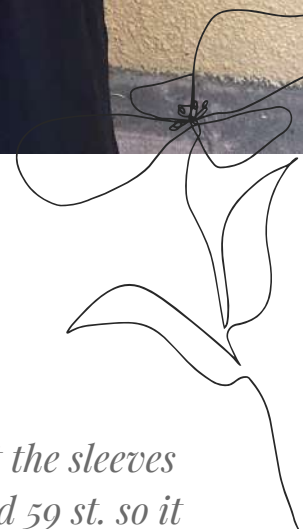


## MODS

*I love the way of the construction. Really nice and easy to follow. First time I do a crop sweater and I loved it. I really like the rsc edging, I think it looks really nice.*







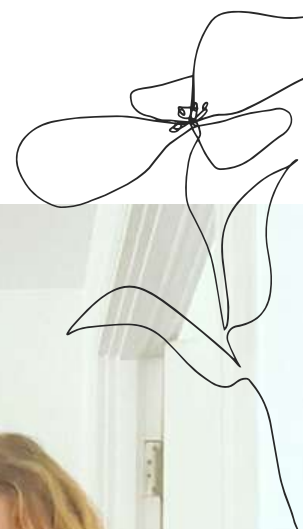

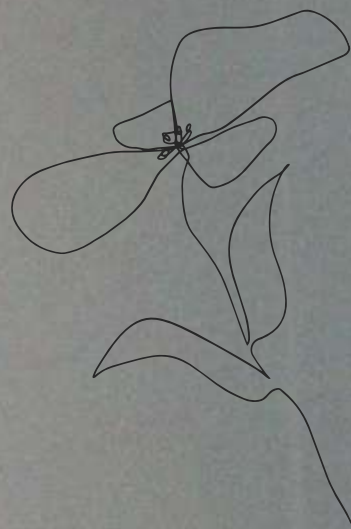
*I decrease the sleeves every 3 rows until 38 stitches where I then worked sc 1 sc decrease around.*
